

CAMP FACILITY & ISLAND SETTING

Camp Trinity is located in Pine Knoll Shores on Bogue Island off the coast of North Carolina at Trinity Center, an Episcopal Camp and Conference Center. The camp is situated along Bogue Sound. The Center has 1500 feet of ocean front property on the Atlantic which is accessed by a tunnel under the island's main highway.

Four dormitories, with two cabins in each dorm, house ten campers and one counselor per cabin. Each cabin counselor is at least 18 years old. Counselors are chosen for their character and experience with children.



Our dining room easily accommodates the camping community.



Many different waterfronts are available to Trinity Campers. Sailing, canoeing and marshing take place at the Sound. Swimming lessons, free swim and water carnival events happen around the pool.

Swimming, sand castle building, games, and beachwalks occur at the beach.

Other program facilities include a covered recreation building, an outdoor recreation field, a challenge course, a Youth Assembly building and a Pavilion on the ocean side.



Sanders Point is an outdoor Chapel overlooking the marsh waters of Bogue Sound. Many worship services are held at the chapel.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- All received applications will be dated. Members of parishes in the Diocese of East Carolina and 2008 campers will be given a preferential registration privilege by date received through March 1st. After this date, we will register all applicants on a first-come, first-served basis as determined by the date each application and deposit was received.

- A \$60 DEPOSIT (\$50 REGISTRATION and \$10 NON-REFUNDABLE PROCESSING FEE) must accompany each 2009 camper application. The deposit will be applied to the total tuition; once a placement is made in a camp session, it is NON-REFUNDABLE.

- FULL TUITION PAYMENTS ARE DUE FOR ALL CAMP SESSIONS BY MAY 1ST.

- THE HEALTH EXAMINATION FORM IS REQUIRED YEARLY AND IS DUE NO LATER THAN 30 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE CAMP SESSION.

- Cancellations must be made in writing. Cancellations post-marked less than 20 days before the session begins will be subject to a penalty of 50% of the camp fee minus the deposit.

- Camp Trinity has a financial assistance policy for those who might otherwise be unable to attend. Camp Trinity may grant financial assistance for one-fourth to one-half of the program cost. We are unable to grant scholarships for the full amount of tuition. When financial aid is requested, it is expected that the parents, guardians, and/or parish take responsibility for part of the tuition and secure a matching amount and/or to then pay the balance. Contact your priest or the camp office for a financial assistance form. We review financial assistance applications in the late spring when the total amount of available funds is known. At that time a letter will be sent to those requesting aid notifying them of the amount of financial assistance granted. All requests for financial assistance require the signature of a priest or minister and should be received in the camp office by March 16.

- Financial assistance scholarships are made possible through gifts and memorial contributions to Camp Trinity. Additional scholarship funds are always needed and welcomed and may be mailed to Camp Trinity, P.O. Drawer 380, Salter Path, NC 28575.

- Specific details of individual programs will be sent upon confirmation of registration.

- Campers are expected to attend an entire camp session.

- Campers may only attend one session per summer, unless space permits after wait list campers have been served.

Trinity Center is located in Pine Knoll Shores on Hwy. 58 on Bogue Banks Island seven miles from Atlantic Beach, NC.

CAMP TRINITY

Camp Trinity is a residential summer camp sponsored by the Episcopal Diocese of East Carolina at Trinity Center. Camp Trinity is in its twenty-first summer season. We look forward to continuing our special programs and traditions for campers here on the banks of Bogue Sound.

Camp Trinity is proud to be accredited by the American Camping Association. Developed exclusively for the camp industry, this nationally recognized program focuses on program quality and health and safety issues and requires us to review every facet of our operation. In 2007 Camp Trinity underwent its ACA Standards Visit (scheduled once every three years), and we scored high marks in all areas.

Camp Trinity offers young people rising 3-12 grades an opportunity to experience camping in an enjoyable and beautiful setting along Bogue Sound and the Atlantic Ocean. Campers share in a Christian program that helps them grow spiritually and emotionally while giving them opportunities to develop new interests, skills, and friendships.

THE GOALS OF CAMP TRINITY ARE:

- To provide a Christian camping experience that is diverse, inclusive, nurturing, loving, and affirming, while challenging each person to be responsible to and for the other.
- To build and live in an intentionally Christ centered community so that each camper might gain a deeper understanding of and appreciation for his/her own skills, abilities, and gifts as a child of God.
- To develop a sense of thankfulness for and stewardship of God's creation.
- To provide a quality Christian Education experience.

In 2008, 612 campers were involved in the summer program. The program in 2009 promises to be as exciting as those in past summers.

The camping program is administered by an experienced staff of college age and older individuals, with a ratio of one staff person for every four campers. The Summer Staff consists of trained counselors who are responsible for the care and nurture of campers in their cabin life and camp activities, program staff who plan and implement the recreational program activities for campers, a certified staff of lifeguards and instructors who oversee the swimming and boating programs, and a nurse who cares for the medical needs of campers.

Camp sessions are led by a volunteer leaders, clergy, and laity who offer exciting Christian Education programs and worship experiences.



SENIOR HIGH CAMP

Senior High Camp, for youths 10 - 12 grades, is a time for young people and adult leaders to come together to talk, play and worship.

A variety of activities will center around a program theme. The activities will include but not be limited to: small group discussions, skits, worship, and "sharesops." We will explore issues such as spirituality, Christian values, societal problems and personal growth. There will be structured group time, activities, and individual free time throughout each day.

DISCOVERERS I, II, III & IV EXPLORERS I, II & III

These are traditional camping programs. They offer a balance of supervised group activities and individual free time. Some of the daily activities include:

- Swimming instruction
- Sailing and canoeing
- Christian Education
- A variety of sports...volleyball, soccer, etc.
- Evening programs...singing, skits, dances, etc.
- Worship
- Arts and crafts
- Elective Shareshops
- Challenge Course/Group Initiatives

Each day ends with the sharing of the day's events, stories, and singing on the oceanside Pavilion or around the campfire.

ADVENTURERS

In 2008, 40 campers attended this session. This camp is designed for persons of all ages with mental and/or physical disabilities. The activities for this special session will be based on our traditional camp programs and adapted when necessary.
